





Internship Program

Placement by Tecnológico de Monterrey:

- √ No cost for placement
- ✓ Enterprises in agreement with the Metropolitan Zone
- ✓ Exchange basis

How students will be matriculated:

- ✓ Exchange student at undergraduate
- √ 2 internship topics
- √ Student can take also 4 extra courses in our Campus if interested

Work hours and credits:

- ✓ Each internship course is equivalent to 160 work hours
- ✓ Part time internship in semester: 25-30 hours per week
- ✓ Each course: 3 USA credits- 8 Mexican units- 5 ECTS

Grades:

- ✓ Inside Tec the student will have a tutor
- √ Final grade: three essays and a final presentation plus the evaluation of the direct boss
- ✓ Official transcript is issued at the end

Internship Program

Migration process:

- √ Unpaid internship
- √ Matriculated as exchange students doing internship for academic purposes
- √ Free nationalities will enter without a visa
 for 180 days
- √ Restricted nationalities will enter with a visa

Periods available for internships:

- ✓ January-May
- ✓ June-July
- ✓ August-December

Summer Program



Summer Program (June or July)

- Summer Certificates: Two summer courses in a specific field, each one lasting 5 weeks and 45 teaching hours
- Summer courses: Students are able to select the courses separately and make their own combination (one or two, each one lasting 5 weeks and 48 teaching hours)
- Summer Courses + internship: You can enroll into one summer course (5 weeks and 48 teaching hours) plus a half time 6 or 8 weeks internship
- Intensive Spanish summer: Basic Spanish, intermediate Spanish, advanced Spanish
- Internship summer: Full time 6 or 8 weeks internship, only available for students from partner universities
- Tailor-made programs: We can also create a special program according to your needs, a minimum of
 12 students will be required

Security approach

BEFORE THE STUDENT ARRIVES:

Welcome Guide and via Facebook group

UPON ARRIVAL

- **Security workshop** during orientation (security inside and outside the campus, in the surroundings, houses, in public transportation, while they travel, with their belongings, and even about cybernetic security.
- We also advise students regarding other matters like cultural shock, water, food, alcohol, drugs, safe sexuality
- **Emergency numbers 24/7** available inside the Campus
- Constant communication Facebook or cell phone.
- We teach students to use the police official app
- PDF- "Safe Campus Mexico City" with all the recommendations about security in Mexico.

DURING THE SEMESTER:

Reminders via Facebook, we post travel warnings before planning trips and vacations around Mexico, and we make them aware about risky places.

International Insurance



- ✓ It is <u>mandatory</u> for students to acquire an international insurance with certain coverages an amounts
- ✓ The insurance plan will be acquired on behalf of the students, each student will pay for it on the orientation week
- √ Special agent 24/7 available for us

International Insurance





If students want to use their own insurance

- √ It is possible if it has equal or better coverages
- √ Insurance company needs to fulfill and sign a <u>waiver document</u>
- √ Send it before the deadline for us to review if it can be approved.
- ✓ Make sure students don't need to pay upfront to be admitted in private hospitals
- ✓ It will not be accepted If it only applies reimbursement
