

HOUSING

Students will receive a list of independent house renting document previously arranged by international programs office. The houses selected have been habituated as student's residences with all services included (phone, laundry, kitchen); the options are walking distance from the Campus.

Students can also select a different housing option, it is not mandatory to stay in the options provided by Tecnológico de Monterrey.

HEALTH INSURANCE

It is mandatory for students to acquire an international insurance with certain coverage and amounts.

The insurance plan will be acquired on behalf of the students and each student will pay for it as part of a summer package.
